Churches across the UK have been invited by the Archbishops of Canterbury and York to join Christians all around the world in a global movement of prayer called **Thy Kingdom Come**. We are invited to pray particularly in the period from **Ascension Day to Pentecost Sunday**, for more people to know Christ's love.

We can respond to this invitation by committing to pray personally during this time, but there will also be the opportunity to come together as a Benefice to pray on **Wednesday 31st May**.

On this day, **Morning Prayer (9am)** and **Holy Communion (10am)** will happen as usual, in **St John's Church, Buttercrambe**, and our prayers and worship in both services will be focussed around Thy Kingdom Come.

Then, from **12 - 5pm** that day, **St John's, Buttercrambe** will remain open for prayer. Could you commit to pray for half an hour at some point during that afternoon, for our Benefice and all those who live and work within it? You can do your half an hour **in church**, where there will be **prayer stations and other materials to engage with** if you find that helpful, or you can pray **at home** or wherever you are at your chosen time.
