From The Vicarage

'With the help of God'and the Archbishop of course!

Firstly I would like to offer a very warm welcome later this summer to my new colleague in the benefice, Hannah. Hannah will be our new Assistant Curate, when she is ordained Deacon in the Minster on 3rd July and will serve her 'title' here among us. As a Curate – a priest in training NOT 'just an extra pair of hands'! – She is here to be guided and supervised by me for three years or so, in preparation for her Priestly duties in her first Parish. I'm not certain you've ever had a curate in the benefice before, but it's always a delight when one is appointed. I know you will all make her very welcome – and hopefully we can share some of her training together.

Hannah's Ordination will contain lots of promises and oaths of allegiance, to which she will have to respond in the affirmative. But, at the tail end of each response that she has to make, there is a little add-on, to which we are all most heartily thankful. Even the Queen, whose 90th birthday is celebrated this year, said something very similar at her Coronation. Quite simply, it is

"With the help of God."

On May 15th, we celebrate the feast of Pentecost (Whit Sunday) in which we remember the very foundation of Church. Jesus had died on Good Friday, risen miraculously on Easter Sunday, and 'ascended' (returned?) to the mysterious realm of God. And yet, he promised that God would never abandon those who turn to him, and the Holy Spirit came and infused



this 'zygote' of apostles, enabling, inspiring and encouraging them to go and tell the good news of Jesus' teaching to all they come across. Without that 'Help of God,' through his Holy Spirit, our Christian way of life and our Church would not have come into being. And that same Holy Spirit still infuses our churches and continues to encourage people like Hannah and so many others every day.

.... and the Archbishop (and Castle Howard) of course!

This year, we are holding a very special Pentecost Celebration at Castle Howard. We're starting with a bring-your-own picnic at 1.30 p.m. followed by a Service of Celebration at 3.00pm which the Archbishop is taking, as part of his Pilgrimage tour of our Deanery. So do come and join us on the day (you'll need an official wrist band in advance, so do let me know)

and also look out for **Thursday May 12th** when he's walking in our benefice. He'd be delighted if you would walk and talk with him, or join him for lunch or tea (details of the day are on the back cover of this Circular and on our Website **www.sandhuttongroup.org.uk**).

We (whether we are 'churched' or not) still need that infusion of God, as Holy Spirit, in our daily lives – we need that 'help of God'. For under our own steam, thinking we know best, our lives can often seem slightly misdirected, a little unfulfilled maybe. But by asking for God's help each day, using his guidelines and his inspiration, it can take on a new and refreshing meaning.

This little prayer sums it up for me:

Dear God, So far today, I've done all right. I haven't gossiped. I haven't lost my temper. I haven't been greedy, grumpy, nasty, selfish, or overindulgent. I am very thankful for that. But, in a few minutes, God, I'm going to get out of bed; and from then on, I'm probably going to need a lot more help.

From the Benefice PCC.....

The Benefice PCC last met on 6th April 2016. Topics discussed were:

- The success of the recent Lent course, "Stop, Luke and listen" and of the Lent lunches. The Easter Day benefice service at Howsham church was particularly uplifting and was attended by about 95 people, including a score of children. Four 'Spa Church' services are planned at monthly intervals during the summer (June, July, August and September) in four different churches (see separate list).
- Planning for Archbishop Sentamu's day in the benefice on Thursday 12th May. This is part of the Archbishop's pilgrimage to all parts of the York Diocese, which has been going on for several months. The Archbishop's week in Southern Ryedale will culminate in a picnic and service at Castle Howard on Sunday 15th May. This will be a wonderful celebration of Pentecost.
- Continuing support and praise for the contribution made by the benefice choir to various services. Now that the choir has grown in numbers, the benefice PCC have agreed to purchase new music folders and additional music for the choir.
- The finances of the PCC are in good order, thanks to the honorary treasurer, David Fletcher.
