Dear Friends,



Sapientia

Frederico Zuccari

O Sapientia....

I should really be writing this piece for the December edition as *O Sapientia* is the opening line from a Latin prayer we use on 17th December. However, it seems so appropriate at any time of doubt, fear or crisis, especially nowadays with the diversity within the political framework our fragile world is governed by.

It means simply 'Wisdom'.

I am often drawn to this phrase when the larger decisions of life are at stake. And one of the many books I turn to include 'Favourite Wisdom' by Deborah Cassidi.

With its front cover depicting *Sapientia* herself from a ceiling fresco by Frederico Zuccari in 1598, the book contains a hotchpotch of favourite sayings from a wide range of people taken from a variety of sources spanning history, culture and religion.

There are the simple sayings

'If in doubt, say nowt'

'There is no 'I' in team'

'Spit on yer 'ands, an' tek a fresh 'old'

and the more thought provoking ones

'If you can't be part of the solution, don't be part of the problem'

'Grow where you are planted'

'Never forget the other person has a point of view too —

and they may be right'

and, thankfully, the humorous ones too

'Being 70 years old is not bad when you consider the alternative!'

'The church is like a swimming pool —

the splashing goes on at the shallow end'

'Take short views — never further than dinner or tea'

They are all quite obvious in their own way, but sometimes I feel we need to be reminded of the obvious because we try to obscure it with complexity. Sometimes we 'can't see the wood for the trees!'

And in reflecting about this, if I had to choose my favourite piece out of the book it would be

'Cultivate simplicity'

For me, that is what true wisdom is. All the great spiritual leaders in history exemplified it: Mohammed, Buddha, the Bhagavad-Gita, Confucius, Ghandi, Mother Teresa and not least of all Jesus.

And what a different world this might be if we all adopted this concept – what a different future the next generations might face.

I wonder what your own favourite piece of 'wisdom' is?

Perhaps it might be good to think about it once again, share it with someone, and act upon it.

Prayers for Wisdom should never just be left for a few days before Christmas, so I'll end with this prayer now and wish you simplicity in your wisdom.

O Sapientia...

Oh come thou wisdom from on high Who orderest all things mightily To us the path of knowledge show And teach us in her ways to go.

Held in aid of York Down's Syndrome Support Group

The three lunches held in the Benefice during Lent were well attended. Vats of delicious soups were made by our hostesses, and much enjoyed by everyone. Very many thanks to all the soup makers, and for everyone's generous donations.

The PCC last met at the end of January 2019. Some of the topics discussed were:

- Parish representatives were encouraged to increase their freewill offering for next year by 5% if possible. As funds are available, Benefice PCC members agreed to make a one-off donation to the Diocese. At present the Diocese is functioning with a recurrent deficit budget, so it is important to be as supportive as possible. It is the Diocese which provides the funding for employing clergy in our Deanery.
- Our curate, Reverend Hannah Suekarran, has secured a new placement at Brayton near Selby as her husband will be taking up a newly created post in that area as minister to those in the 20 to 40 year-old age group.
- We were reminded that a new electoral roll must be set up for each parish before the PCC APCM (equivalent to an annual general meeting)
- The mission emphasis in the Benefice will be on LYCIG (Leading Your Church Into Growth), making church inclusive and affirming. There is already evidence of growth in the increasing size of congregations and of those staying for fellowship and hospitality at the end of the service.
- Four official chalice bearers were to be licensed by Bishop John. This has now been done.

The next meeting will be on Wednesday 8th May at 7.30 pm at Wood House, Thornton-le-Clay. As usual the Honorary Secretary, Wendy Holman, is happy to receive items for the agenda.

Sydney Smith

The Rev. Sydney Smith was honoured by York Civic Trust on April 10th with a Blue Plaque on Moorhouse, Heslington, where he lived from 1809 - 1814.

He was born in 1771, educated in Winchester and Oxford. He spent some time in Edinburgh where he met the men with whom he was to found the EDINBURGH REVIEW, a successful and widely read journal devoted to literary criticism and audacious political comment. He became a leading figure in intellectual and Whig circles.

Sydney Smith's association with Yorkshire began in 1805 when he was granted the living of Foston. He rapidly became the idol of his parishioners, acting as doctor and magistrate and a welcome guest at Castle Howard.

He was an intellectual, a renowned wit, a friend of both rich and poor. His causes included many that offended the hierarchies of the day: abolition of slavery, Catholic emancipation, repeal of the Game laws, legal representation for the accused, but his outspoken opinions won him no ecclesiastical favours.

He became Canon of Bristol Cathedral when he exchanged his living at Foston and was promoted Canon of St Paul's Cathedral. He died in London, in February 1845. His legacy deserves greater recognition.

Some of us had the pleasure of attending a service at Strensall Church to celebrate the baptism of Hannah and Rob's baby son, Reuben Joel, a very

joyful occasion. We wish the Suekarran family the best of everything for the next stage in their life journey.

Messy Palms – the Journey to Jerusalem – was held in Gate Helmsley Village Hall on 13th April, the day before Palm Sunday. There was a definite buzz in the air as 41 children and their families explored this important story, making representations of the cross, the Bible and the donkey.

At our APCM Anne Podmore relinquished her role as Churchwarden. We thank Anne for her many years of service and welcome Sue Hanson as the new Churchwarden.

Unfortunately, the church boiler has come to the end of its life. Replacing it will add to the financial burden that the PCC currently faces because of repair work needed to the church fabric. It may provide some opportunities for change and improvement, such as bringing a mains water supply into the church. We are grateful for a recent personal donation to church funds. We hope and pray that parishioners will care enough for this beautiful church to be willing to contribute to our forthcoming fundraising efforts as we seek to maintain the building for future generations.

HOWSHAM

We have had a tree survey which found all the trees in the Churchyard to be in a satisfactory state. Unfortunately, some more of the boundary wall has collapsed and will shortly be repaired. We are now applying for grants to help us pay for repairs to our stained glass.

We would have liked to repair the bells, ahead of the six weddings in Church this year. The initial survey is not hopeful.

We are also going to have the heating repaired. We are very grateful to Bossall PCC for providing us with a new electric organ which should soon be installed.


