From Rev Nigel.....

At the time of writing this piece we are finally enjoying some warm weather after the rather damp and cool days of early July. As the children break up for their summer holidays, I do hope the weather remains good for them.



Summer is a lovely time to be outdoors, whether it's relaxing in the garden, walking the dogs, visiting one of the historical places in our area, or taking a trip to the beach, it is so much better than being cooped up indoors.

Being outside amongst God's creation gives us a chance to perhaps enjoy life at a less frantic pace. Being amongst nature is widely recognized as being extremely good for our health and wellbeing, and if we can pause and just have some quiet time feeling the sun on our faces (but not too much!) and listening to the sounds of nature, we can calm our minds and boost our energy.

Taking such time out is also good spiritually. Our Lord Jesus, as the Gospels tell us, often went off quietly on his own to pray.

If you're not familiar with it, praying can, at first, seem a bit awkward. But talking to God doesn't have to be formal, and the language doesn't have to be flowery. It really is just like having a conversation. We can talk about the things that we are thankful for, the things that bring us joy, the worries we may have. We can talk about other people too, what we wish for them, how much we love them, how much we want them to be better if they are unwell. We really can talk to God about anything.

Sometimes, and I'm guilty of this too, we can talk a bit too much and forget to listen. Just being quiet is part of prayer, that is when we listen to God. We may not hear an actual voice, but God does speak to us and things in our lives can change because of prayer and listening.

So, during these summer weeks, try to take time out to be amongst nature, to enjoy it, and when possible, and I do realise for some having the kids at

home makes life even more hectic, find time to just be still and quiet. If you want to, have a chat with God. Our churchyards are lovely quiet outdoor spaces.

Perhaps some of you want to pray more but you're really not sure how to go about it, or maybe you feel a bit daft trying it. If it would help, you can always talk to me, or anyone from our ministry team, and we can give some guidance. But it really is not complicated.

In any case, you can be assured that the worshipping community in all our churches are often praying for everyone who lives in our benefice area, that includes you.

Whatever you are doing, wherever you are going during this summer holiday period, I wish you and those you love every blessing.

Can you spare some time to join our small team to help organise and attend our allotment and other support sessions?





The Benefice of Harton Christmas Shoebox Appeal 2024

Our Christmas shoeboxes for Romania will be entering its ninth year this time round and we are enormously grateful for all the support we receive from across the Benefice area and beyond. It's useful to keep this giving in mind so that items can be collected as the months go by.



Thank you so much for giving and bringing hope and love to very poor families in Romania through the shoebox appeals in recent years. Last year we had 172 boxes and £342 towards carriage etc.

Our shoeboxes are not just for children. At the request of the partner church in Romania we also encourage supporters to put items in the shoebox which will be gifts for parents and grandparents. We hope to have leaflets about this year's Shoebox Appeal by August 2024 which will then be distributed to households, businesses and schools. Last year we suggested that any box of a similar size to a shoebox could be used. With the rise of online shopping many items arrive in boxes of all sizes and recycling is always good! However, in order to keep the distribution fair amongst the recipients please do not use large boot boxes or equivalent.

In addition to the shoeboxes, this year we plan to send blankets and good quality baby clothes (please mark bags and boxes of these very clearly). Please note hand knitted baby clothes are not required. There is also a need for pushchairs and Moses baskets.

We are aware that transport costs continue to rise. We appreciate this is a tough time for lots of people in the UK but hope many will put the full £3 on a box rather than the minimum £2. We are always happy to receive donations towards transport.

The shoeboxes given will be blessed at the Benefice church service at Upper Helmsley at 10am on Sunday 3 November 2024 prior to the start of their transportation to Romania on 9 November 2024.

This year David Fletcher plans to join the Amen team going to Romania! He will be able to see the other end of the operation and meet some of our lovely partners in Romania. All team members pay for all their own expenses related to the trip and nothing is paid by the charity Amen.

My Dear Friends,

During the Covid lockdowns I got into the habit of watching 'Songs of Praise' which I came to look forward to week after week. The uplifting hymns and inspirational stories were a joy at a rather dismal time. One hymn in particular comes to mind and I often find myself singing it

GATE HELMSLEY

Thank you to Michael Harran for continuing to lead the maintenance and management of St Mary's churchyard. We are very grateful to those of you who support him in this work – be it by cutting hedges, mowing the grass or general clearing. Special thanks to Christine Bickerdike who has cleared out and beautifully replanted the bed near the church tower.

Because it has been such a wet season, the growth in the older part of the churchyard has been tremendous, resulting in rampaging brambles, nettles and thistles growing around the boundary. There are plans for the "churchyard gang" to come together over a couple of weekends for some major clearance. We are very grateful for this and will be pleased to provide plentiful refreshments to keep you going.

Of course, we will continue to maintain the churchyard in the best interests of nature, leaving areas unmown to encourage wildflowers, insects and birds. By doing this, our churchyard helps to replace some of the lost flower meadows across the UK.

As noted previously, recommendations from our church architect's fiveyearly report include the repair and refurbishment of the rainwater goods around the church. This will involve major works at a high cost. Applications for help with funding will be made to various grant-giving bodies. This will not be sufficient without additional fundraising locally. We propose setting up a small subgroup of the PCC to lead on finance and fundraising, so we will be inviting parishioners with this kind of expertise to help us out with this crucial task.

We had a very happy get-together at the Annual Strawberry Lunch in Gate Helmsley village hall on 14th July, enjoying excellent fellowship and good food. Thank you to all those who helped in so many different ways to make this event a success which raised a welcome £680 for church funds.

The next similar event will be on Thursday 26th September. A Harvest Festival service will be held in the church at 6.00pm, followed by a Harvest Supper afterwards in the village hall.

Another happy occasion was the baptism of Annie Iona Mc Boyle on 5th May, which was followed on 1st June by the marriage of Annie's aunt, Emma Dziemianko to Richard Vincent. This was a really beautiful service, and the church was decorated naturally with vases of wildflowers. Thank you to Dan, Neil and Michael who rang the church bells so enthusiastically to celebrate the wedding.

On a sadder note, there have been two deaths recently in the parish. Margaret Jordan died on 5th June, and Lyndsay O'Hara on 12th June. Both funerals were held at York Crematorium. We send condolences to Chuck Richardson and David O'Hara and all of Margaret and Lyndsay's families as they grieve the loss of their loved ones.

Previously we briefly reported the death in April of Captain Dick Garnons-Williams, formerly of the Manor House. Dick had an impressive naval funeral at Long Ashton near Bristol where he had lived latterly.

Dick's ashes will be interred at St Mary's next to his late wife, Anne, after a service on Friday 20th September at 2.30 pm. Everyone who knew Dick is welcome to attend the service, and the reception afterwards at Gate Helmsley village hall. We offer our deepest sympathy to Dick's family – Elizabeth, Antonia and William, and the wider family – in their loss.

We are pleased that so many people enjoy visiting our Victorian church and leave warm messages in the visitors' book. The refreshments are no doubt an attraction, as are the prayer table and the creative displays designed by Mandy and David Fletcher. Thank you both.

One notable visitor during June was Howard the Pilgrim, on his walking pilgrimage from Walsingham to Iona. He pitched his tent for the night in a neighbouring garden and was very grateful for the hospitality. We wonder if Howard has reached his destination by now.

Rob was known to many in our villages for his humour, his support for local groups, his love of life and people. Rob invariably had a smile on his face and had a warmth towards others. Family, colleagues and friends gathered to celebrate his life and share memories.

We offer our condolences to Caroline, Christopher and Rob's loved ones and a wish that their fond memories will bring some comfort as they grieve.

St Mary's was the setting for two weddings in July. Our congratulations go to Rebecca Coupland and James Speck who were married on 5th July and to Chloe Hill and Samuel Calpin who were married on 6th July. We wish both couples every happiness in their future lives together.

The quinquennial report was conducted in June and has not revealed any major problems at Whitwell. There was only one pigeon in the loft, which is brilliant - and this has now been banished!

We are delighted to be welcoming The Victorian Society who will be visiting Whitwell on the Hill on the weekend of $27^{\text{th}}/28^{\text{th}}$ July 2024. Our Church of St John the Evangelist is a building by the noted architect George Street, who was born on 20^{th} June 1824. The church in its magisterial position in the beautiful County of Yorkshire is a particularly wonderful example of the work of the architect. Our stained glass windows are of special importance.

The churchwarden services have now taken place. Emma and I went to Escrick, St Helen's to be sworn in and it was a lovely service. The church is beautiful and well worth a visit if you are passing.

Nothing else to report from Whitwell; the church is open throughout the summer and the rain continues to fall.

To celebrate the bicentenary of the birth of the great Victorian architect, George Edmund Street (1824-1881), the Victorian Society has arranged a series of monthly events between March and December 2024. These comprise lectures, visits to buildings, a two-day symposium and a book launch.

On 27/28 July, the Society will be visiting the churches in the East Riding that Street built or restored for Sir Tatton Sykes II, together with a number of the associated parish buildings. The tour starts at St John the Evangelist, Whitwell on the Hill, and continues to Howsham, Thixendale, Fimber, Wansford, Kirkburn and Bishop Wilton.

On the second day, the Society will visit East Heslerton, Weaverthorpe, Helperthorpe, Sledmere, West Lutton, Kirkby Grindalythe and Garton-on-the-Wolds.

Although Street is probably best known for designing the Royal Courts of Justice on the Strand, London, he was, as the East Riding shows, a most

prolific church builder as well as the author of many books and papers on architecture. His early death, at the age of 57, was probably brought on by overwork. The Royal Courts of Justice, for which he did every one of the 3,000 drawings, were completed one year later.


