From Rev Nigel.....

At the time of writing this we are still enjoying (or enduring) rather warm weather. I do hope everyone has been able to remain as comfortable as possible. I know I have found the nights rather difficult at times.

I am old enough to remember the long hot Summer of 1976. It was when I, as an eighteen-year-old soldier fresh out of training, flew out to what was then West Germany for my first foreign posting. What followed was a great adventure in many foreign countries, that lasted many years.

But just before making that journey, having finished my trade training at Catterick, I found myself for a few weeks in 'Holding Troop'. This was where young soldiers waiting for postings or to start courses worked and were given all sorts of tasks to do, some OK, and some really rather unpleasant.



As a result of the prolonged hot weather there were serious fires on the North York Moors, and a number of us were tasked with assisting the Fire Brigade in keeping the fires contained. Having been taken up to the moors on trucks, we were quickly briefed, issued with beaters, which were long poles with some sort of heavy flexible sheet on the end,

something akin to lino, and set to work beating down fires wherever they flared up.

It was exhausting, hot work, made all the more unpleasant because of the smoke. It was also quite dangerous work and, as I discovered, very frightening at times. I remember, having successfully beaten down a flare up, a mate and I were taking a bit of a breather when a breeze caused a sudden flare up and we quickly found ourselves surrounded by burning heather. The only thing we could do was jump through the flames to get to a safer spot. Combat trousers a bit singed, we both got to safety unscathed but shaken. Fortunately, some of our comrades were there to make sure we were OK.

There were other times over the following years in the Army when, because I was doing my duty and the job I was paid for, I found myself at risk of harm. We accepted it because it was what was expected and, through training we were prepared.

When Jesus was preparing his Disciples for the times ahead when he would no longer be with them, he did not hold back on describing the risks and dangers they would face. The disciples were told that they would be ridiculed, persecuted, arrested, imprisoned or perhaps even face an untimely end because of their faith in Jesus Christ. Despite that, as we can read about in the New Testament in 'Acts', they continued to face those risks.



Even today, we who try to be good Christian disciples, can face risk. In some parts of the world being a Christian can actually be dangerous. But even here in our pretty safe country, Christians can face ridicule or have to deal with secular workplace rules that mean they cannot be open about their faith. Perhaps that all paints a pretty bleak picture of what being a Christian is like. However, the risks we take in the name of Jesus are far outweighed by the benefits of having a loving relationship with God through Jesus Christ and enjoying Christian fellowship in a worshiping community.

In the Harton Benefice we have ten churches, but rather than being ten separate congregations we are a Benefice community which comes together to worship and enjoy wonderful fellowship. It brings together people from all the villages in an area similar in size to the island of Guernsey. It is a community that cares for one another. We are there to make sure we are all OK.

Of course, we don't just care for those in our church community. We care very much about and pray for everyone who lives in, works in, visits and travels through our area.

We also have a Pastoral Care Team, a team of people who visit and/or call on people who may not be able to come to church, either temporarily or permanently.

Our Youth and Families Worker, Rachael, is running some wonderful schemes the details of which can be found on the benefice website and in the events section of this Circular. Mums and young babies and toddlers will be welcome at the LAMBS sessions every Tuesday during August - 9.30am to 11.30am in St Mary's, Sand Hutton, where they can share a cuppa and have a chat and there is a safe indoor play area. This will run throughout the Summer Holidays and beyond. Dates on the website.

Please do check out the benefice website to see when and where our services and other events are. We would love to make you feel welcome and if you are uneasy about coming to a church service, there will be someone to make sure you are OK.

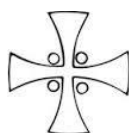

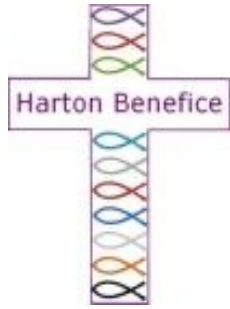

Benefice PCC.....

The Benefice PCC last met on 9th July and will meet again on 15th October at 10.00 am at Crambe House, Crambe.

Main discussions at the last meeting centred on funding for the post of Leader for Youth and Families, and on the need to bring all PCC members up to date on Safeguarding.

Crambe PCC is kindly funding the Youth and Families post for a year until October 2026. Other PCCs are reminded of their obligation to make a regular contribution to fund this valuable work. It is also hoped that individuals will make their own personal donations.

The benefice Lead for Safeguarding, Anna Sawkins, is anxious to receive responses from each PCC to a series of questions that she has circulated about the safeguarding status of all PCC members. Anna will also be completing several DBS checks over the summer.

We also discussed a plan to update and reprint the benefice orders of service, and the lack of toilet facilities in most of our churches. This is problematic for weddings and funerals when guests may have travelled a long distance. It also limits the use of some churches for Rachael Tearney's activities with children.

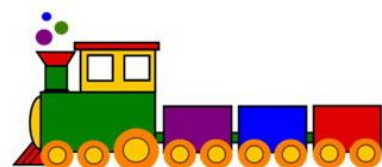

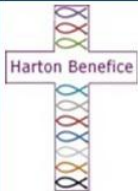

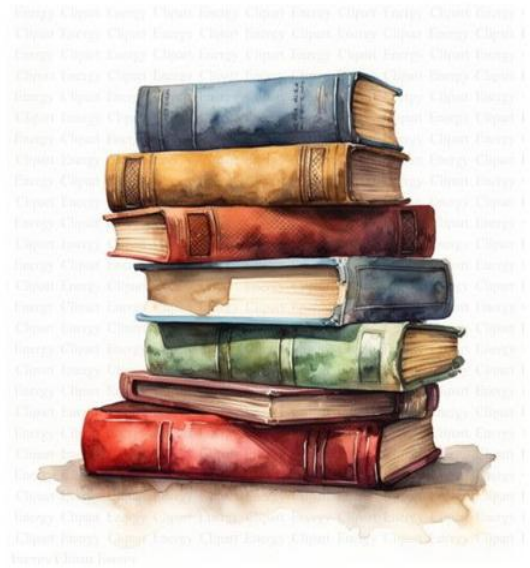

Fred was the gamekeeper at Buttercrambe Estate and lived in Moor Cottage in the middle of Moor Wood.

St Mary's "Roof it or lose it" appeal

St Mary's Church is a Grade II listed building of rich historical and architectural interest, built in 1840. The nave roof is the original roof from that time. The nails securing the original Westmorland slates are corroding and failing, a process known as "nail sickness". This has resulted in slates increasingly becoming loose, slipping and falling off the roof. As there is no membrane beneath, if the roof issues are not addressed, the loss of slates will allow rainwater to penetrate. Persistent water ingress will cause the underlying structure to become damp and rot, weakening the overall structural integrity of the building and damage to the interior.

We do not want the church to close. We want to ensure its history, heritage and use remain for the future.

We need to raise in the region of £65,000 to undertake the critical works to the south roof slope, ridge and coping stones. This is a huge amount for us to raise; we are exploring all grant options but these are very limited.

The PCC are extremely grateful to those people who have very kindly made a donation so far. Thank you – it means so much.
