Dear Friends,

Remember, Remember.....

As I'm writing this article for November, I reflected on what a disturbing, unsettling and challenging time our world is going through.

It seems that every continuing action of Russia's invasion of Ukraine and every reaction by 'the west' has a profound impact on so many daily lives. All this compounded locally, by an ever-changing government in the UK. And of course, in the midst of this turmoil, the one seemingly ever-present Monarch that we that relied upon for decades, Queen Elizabeth, suddenly isn't there anymore.

It's as though our world is shifting out of kilter and we're stumbling around in the autumn and winter gloom, trying to regain our balance, desperately trying to find something firm to hang on to.

Perhaps these feelings can be best summed up by Thomas Hood's famous poem from 1844:

'No sun – no moon!
No morn – no noon –
No dawn – no dusk – no proper time of day.
No warmth, no cheerfulness, no healthful ease,
No comfortable feel in any member –
No shade, no shine, no butterflies, no bees,
No fruits, no flowers, no leaves, no birds – November!'



And yet, for us as Christians – as a church – our seasons and feasts remind us that there is a hope and a presence we can hold on to, whatever state of stability or fragility our lives may be in.

At All Hallows (All Saints and All Souls) we remember that life doesn't end in death, but is transformed into new life; Remembrance Sunday reminds us of the sacrifice of others who enabled disorder to become a new and better order; and of course, Christmas reminds us that belief in the one who came to save and guide us can bring peace to the storms of troubled minds and lives if we follow his pathway.

Jesus helps us, encourages us - enables us - to become advocates and agents of change for good; to bring calm to places of anxiety; to be present in times of uncertainty; to be a light in the gloom and darkness of life.

So, let's turn to another poet, Elizabeth Stoddard, to help us through this winter of discontent and help us remember the hope that is set before us.

'Much have I spoken of the faded leaf; Long have I listened to the wailing wind, And watched it ploughing through the heavy clouds; For autumn charms my melancholy mind. When autumn comes, the poets sing a dirge: The year must perish; all the flowers are dead; The sheaves are gathered; and the mottled guail runs in the stubble, but the lark has fled! Still, autumn ushers in the Christmas cheer, The holly-berries and the *ivy-tree*: They weave a chaplet for the Old Year's heir; These waiting mourners do not sing for me! I find sweet peace in depths of autumn woods, where grow the ragged ferns and roughened moss; The naked, silent trees have taught me this, – The loss of beauty is not always loss!'

Reading back over my article from this time last year we were only just beginning to take the tentative steps to ease ourselves out of lockdown and looking forward to having a Christmas with family and friends. Luckily this year has gone well in terms of us being free from further lockdowns or school closures and our children and families are managing to re-establish routines and get back to a sense of normality. However, we remember in our prayers those families who are incomplete because they have lost loved ones, or have family members who are continuing to shield.

Over the summer months The Play & Pray group continued to have fun meeting at Upper Helmsley allotment, planting, watering and weeding. Unfortunately, due to the drought we experienced in June and July, (and our far from ideal watering system in the allotment), we didn't fare as well this year in terms of produce from the allotment. Water butts ran dry and we had to resort to bringing water in. A massive 'Thank you' to Phil, Mari, Alan, Katie, Carolyn, The Robinsons, Emma, Lucy, Elisabeth, Catherine, Toby, and all of the Aubergines who valiantly kept things watered as best we could. Luckily the Fire Service came to our rescue once again, and a massive 'Thank you' has to go to them for kindly visiting us back in Summer. We need to put our thinking caps on for next year, or maybe more water butts.....

This years 'Wonderzone' Summer club was another great success; running over three days. It was a joint venture between ourselves and Lisa Horton, Benefice of Rural East York. We had over forty children attend on each day, and were delighted to welcome Marion from Yoyo and Mary from Dunnington, who ran drama workshops in the afternoons. Lisa and I aimed to run a holiday club that would be inexpensive, safe, and most of all fun for the children, with a strong Christian message. We feel pleased that we achieved this. Hopefully it also helped parents out with the tricky conundrum of holiday childcare too!

The Aubergines have kept busy also. They continued to meet fortnightly right up until the summer break, and some of them came along to help at the Summer Club. Now that we are in a new school year, we have recruited more new members and are looking forward to having a stall at the Sand Hutton Christmas Crafts Fayre in November. Benefice PCC.....



The Benefice PCC last met on 4th October, when discussions centred on the following areas:



• Rachael Harrison is currently on sabbatical. A strategy for the future of the Children and Youth post has been developed by the mentorship team

- The parishes should submit their Free Will Offering as soon as possible
- Benefice finances: parishes will be given a 50% rebate in 2023. The Rector will explore the possibility of obtaining extra funding for the Children and Youth post from "Multiply" monies.
- Deanery development: the Deanery plan proposes a division of the Southern Ryedale Deanery into 3 areas – Harton, Howardian and Street; Malton and Norton; Wolds, Buckrose and Buckrose Carr. More details can be found in the full minutes of the meeting (available from the Honorary Secretary).
- Developing a cohesive benefice strategy: to this end, each PCC was asked to develop their 5 local priorities, which will subsequently be combined into a benefice-wide strategy.
- Safeguarding: details of PCC members from every parish to be made available to the Safeguarding Officer (Emma Allen-Goss) for 3-yearly DBS checks.
- Plans to be made to display the vestments of the late Reverend Jeremy Valentine to determine their future use.
- Statistics for Mission: The Rector agreed to submit a single benefice return to make the statistics more meaningful

The next meeting will be held at Holderness House, Claxton at 2.00 pm on Tuesday 17th January 2023. Please send agenda items in advance to the Honorary Secretary, Ellen Stott.



My Dear friends,

One of my visits to the Arboretum at Castle Howard last week got me thinking about the season of Autumn. The trees adorned in their glorious apparel and the beauty of it all aglow in the sunshine. The falling leaves of red, orange,

browns and yellows. Freshly ploughed fields ready for next year's crops. The purples and pinks of the Michaelmas daisies in people's gardens. The bright red berries on the holly bushes that the birds love so much. Birds lining up on the wires ready for their long journeys to foreign lands. All signs of this amazing season.

As I grow older, with each passing year I realise that I too am in the season of the autumn of my life. Not being able to move about as easily as I did in my younger years, those extra aches and pains, falling asleep after lunch, and not finding it as easy to get out of bed in the morning. Greetings from Whitwell:


